Comments

1. The Platoon included 3 Serjeants and 6 Corporals; it is likely that 2 of the Corporals were Lance-serjeants, who each commanded a Detachment, with the other two Detachments commanded by Serjeants.
2. One of the two Mortar Platoons could be converted to a Machine Gun Platoon by replacing the four 3-inch mortars with four Vickers medium machine guns.

Notes

1. The original War Establishment table does include any information on the numbers of individual weapons, aside from sniper rifles. The Administrative Platoon included a pool of 54 standard No.4 rifles.
2. A note stated that the 2-inch mortars, airborne, could be issued in lieu of 2-inch mortars. This might suggest that standard 2-inch mortars were now considered the normal issue.
3. A batman was provided for each Officer and the attached Medical Officer (RAMC).
4. The water dutyman and 17 batmen across the Battalion were also trained as Drivers, I.C.
5. No rank is stated for either the Battalion Quarter-master or the attached Medical officer (RAMC).
6. There is almost no indication as to how the 39 Lance-corporals posts were likely to be allocated across the Battalion. It seems reasonable to assume this figure would allow for one per Rifle Section.
7. The annotation ≠ in the foregoing indicates 'non-jumpers'.
8. There is no indication in the W.E. of the internal organization of the Anti-tank Platoon. My suggestion would be three Anti-tank Sections, each of a Corporal and 9 men, with 3 PIATs per Section, and a Protective Section of a Corporal and 6 men, with 2 LMGs and 1 PIAT.
